Year 1 trip to Peterborough Museum

On Wednesday the Year 1 class enjoyed a fabulous day at Peterborough Museum. It was a whole day exploring learning linked to our current History theme and encouraged the children to think about how children played in the past. The day included being introduced to some very old toys, playing with toys and a toy trail around the galleries in the museum. The children also enjoyed making their own toy to bring back with them. The children responded enthusiastically to all of the opportunities and should be proud of the way they represented our School.











Dentist Visits Year 4

As part of Year 4's science unit relating to the digestive system, Mrs Ogden who is a dentist, came to speak to the class. Mrs Ogden revised the different names and functions of teeth and explained how and why it is so important to look after our teeth. The children asked interesting questions and were delighted to be given free toothpaste and information leaflets.



Later in the week, a comparative test was set up to compare the effect of different drinks (water, milk and coke) on teeth. Year 4 will examine the results next week.

<u> Year 5 - DT Project</u>

Year 5 have recently been designing their own moving wooden toy, inspired by the Victorians. Using Cams, the toys will move according to the children's designs. Hopefully, we will have some finished items to show you next week!





For their History lesson this week, the children learnt about some of the hard labour activities Victorian prisoners faced. The **treadwheel** was a monotonous task whereby prisoners turned a large wheel over and over again using the force of their legs (replicated by going up and down the bench), the **shot drill** was where prisoners had to move a heavy object from a specific place to another specific place (lifting the heavy buckets) and the **crank** was another monotonous task using their arms (holding the skipping ropes taught). The activities were all carried out in absolute silence and definitely weren't meant to be enjoyable!







Make-do and mend' in Year 6

There has been a hive of activity in year 6 this week as they children have been working hard on sewing their tool belts inspired by the 'make-do and mend' initiative from WW2. The children brought in old pillowcases and sheets to use to make their tool belts which will incorporate useful pouches. The class are hoping to use the product when they visit Aylmerton on their residential trip in the new year.
