Reception

As part of our learning about Celebrations, Reception Class have been finding out about rituals including Remembrance Day. We have looked at poppies and why we wear and display them. We made our own poppies and turned them into wreaths which we then laid at the flagpole in Lawrance Park. The children listened to the bugle call and had a quiet moment of stillness and reflection to say thank you to soldiers who have kept us safe.

The children listened to a real-life story about Mrs Dubell's Grandad who was in the Second World War and looked at pictures and artefacts from his experience. The children shared some of their own thoughts and stories about Grandparents, the past, dying, wars, feeling brave and feeling scared. We lit a candle and watched the CBeebies animation called Poppies. The children were all very respectful and some engaged very thoughtfully in the discussions and rituals. They are excited to look out for symbols and memorials on their travels around Bourne and Thurlby this weekend.





<u>Year 1</u>

In year one this week, we had our class assembly. We based our class assembly around our PSHE learning, which was about how we can make each other feel special and safe. We sang two songs in the assembly and the children even learnt Makaton signs to accompany one of the songs.

They did an amazing job and really enjoyed performing to the whole school and the parents.





<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 had a great first session with Eddy Mentzel as part of the Creative Hive project. They had fun with the 'Incredibox' app, creating music from a variety of beat box sounds, before starting work on their own Stone Age piece of music with the 'Garageband' app. We are looking forward to our sessions with Eddy for the rest of the term.




<u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 had their first forest school session of this term. They showed excellent co-operation and collaboration while creating rockets, which linked brilliantly to their space topic in science. They also created the planets in our solar system with many different natural resources.



<u>Year 6</u>

This term, the Year 6 children are studying 'Forces' as their Science topic. After learning about gravity and then air resistance, they went on to devise an investigation on speed of descent with 'helicopter spinners' they then manufactured. By repeatedly changing one independent variable, they measured the impact on the speed of descent. The best part, they had to repeat each test several times and many 'flying hours' were achieved to their obvious enjoyment!









Roots to Food

We were delighted to welcome Darren Tinkler, of Roots to Food, back this week. Darren worked with Year 6, Reception and Year 1, separately, so the children could prepare and cook a tasty Italian dish. Each child was taught how to complete the 'claw' and 'bridge' to chop safely and they also learnt all about the nutritional value of the food whilst cooking. At the end of the session, the children were able to taste their efforts and there were empty plates all round. It was delicious!

Pan Fried Pesto Chicken in a Chunky Tomato Sauce Served with Steamed Pasta and Wilted Greens

INGREDIENTS - Serves 4 portions

Diced Chicken Fillet or Vegetarian Quorn Fillets - 360g Chunky Diced Fresh Tomatoes - 2 Fresh Basil - 10 leaves Fresh Garlic - 2 cloves (crushed and peeled) Diced Spanish Onions - 1 large 1 Small Red Pepper (diced) Olive Oil - 2 tbls Black Pepper - 2 pinches Pre Cooked Pasta Shells - 200g Chopped Tomatoes Tinned - 200g Fresh Spinach Leaves - 240g Sliced Spring Onions - 60g Sour Cream - 50 ml Method

- 1. To make the nut free Pesto place the olive oil and basil leaves into a food processor and blitz for 20 seconds.
- 2. Place the chicken into a bowl and add the pesto. Stir, mix, and fold to marinade the chicken with the pesto.
- 3. In a wok or shallow frying pan heat 2 tbls water until it steams, then add the chicken to seal, add the onions and fresh tomatoes. Place a lid on the pan and steam for 90 seconds. Carefully remove the lid. Now add the chopped tinned tomatoes, red peppers and spring onion and bring to a simmer for 1 minute. Now add the fresh spinach leaves and fold through gently until the leaves have wilted through the sauce and chicken.
- 4. Add the pasta shells to the pan, stir through, add black pepper to season and switch off the pan
- 5. Serve the food into the centre of a plate or large pasta bowl and lightly splash sour cream over the top with a fork. ENJOY!
