Calling all musicians - Band opportunity

We have been fortunate in receiving some funding from Lincolnshire Music Service to run an orchestra for all our children who learn an instrument. This is an opportunity for all musicians at any stage or grade (even complete beginners) to come together to learn ensemble skills, play music with other young people and have fun.

This opportunity is completely free of charge and open to all

children who learn an instrument either in or out of school. They must bring their instrument with them (excluding pianos and drum kits- we have a full drum kit, additional percussion and plenty of keyboards).

The band/orchestra is held at **Bourne Westfield Primary Academy** every Wednesday after school from 4-5pm in the music room. Access to the music room is through the large green gates at the right side of the school. It will run for 5 weeks before half term and then 3 weeks after half term with a concert on the 12th March. Details of this will follow.

Mrs Beavis from Bourne Westfield will be running the orchestra along with staff from Lincolnshire Music service and she is very keen to get as many children involved as possible.
