Reception - Tiny Steps Farm

On Monday, Reception went on a mini adventure; out of the village and into the countryside to Tiny Steps Farm.

We started our trip by going through the school gate, around the car park, through the park and under the trees. We went down an alleyway, (safely) over some roads, past the Methodist church and into a car yard. Then we made our journey into the countryside: through the swishy swashy grass; over the stile and bridge; through the kissing gate; through the potato field; across the old farmyard and into the farm The children made lots of connections with stories they have read.

At the farm, the children walked goats, brushed donkeys, held chickens and fed goats, alpacas and pigs as well as stroking horses. We are so proud of how far the children walked and how well behaved and polite they were at the farm. They enjoyed sharing all their knowledge about the animals, parts of the village and the countryside.



When we got back, despite being very tired, we made a map of our journey, drew and wrote a thank you messages and about what we had seen. We also used bricks and construction to build a farm and school building. Thank you to Tracy and her team for showing us around and to Mrs Baldwin and Mrs Cappitt for volunteering their help. We all slept very well that night!









Year 2 - Geography Trip to Math Wood

Year 2 had a wonderful adventure on their recent trip to Math Wood. With big smiles and lots of enthusiasm, they walked beautifully through Thurlby village. Using road signs to guide them, the children spotted different physical and human geographical features along the way. The children also noticed how the roads and paths changed as we got closer to the woods and discussed why this might happen. It was great to see how the children enjoyed exploring their local area and learning more about the world around them.







Forest School

Year 2 had their first Forest school session last Friday. They decided together what the rules would be and then explored the outdoor area, by moving in the form of different animals; they were gorillas, birds, worms, lions and frogs. Next, the children went on an insect hunt and used tick sheets to see if they could find the different insects on the sheet. They worked in pairs and used magnifying glasses to observe the insects in closer detail and collection pots to show their friends what they found. The children showed great teamwork and cooperation and it was lovely to see their excitement when they found the insects. There were lots of snails, ladybirds, flies, a black beetle and a millipede.







Eco-Green Day

School was awash with green and blue on Wednesday as each class took action to help improve the health of our planet.

Year 1

Year 1 focused on the importance of recycling. We began by exploring what recycling means and identifying items that can be recycled. Pupils then took part in a fun "recycle relay," sorting materials into correct recycling categories. Next, the children designed vibrant new signs for our paper recycling bins—each class teacher selected a favourite to display in their classroom. We also learned a recycling themed song and crafted musical instruments from recycled materials to accompany it.

To finish the day, the children transformed old CDs into beautiful, colourful bird decorations. Fantastic work, Year 1!










Year 4

Year 4 began their day by exploring the possible causes of local river pollution. The children thought about the effects of this problem on wildlife - we were all rather shocked to discover microplastics within aquatic food chains! We use the Rivers Trust ecology map to further explore the health of our local rivers, especially the Welland as we were excited to discover there are otters living so close to Thurlby. Throughout the day and as we brainstormed solutions for river pollution, children helped our 'Coin River' grow - thank you to all those who donated some pennies.

Once the money has been counted, Year 4 will be sending the money to the Rivers Trust to support their work on improving the health of our rivers. Well done, Year 4 - you helped our planet.





Year 5

Year 5 have had an interactive learning week, enjoying lots of fun during Eco-Green Day. Our mission was to clean up space. The children explored what space junk is, why it is a problem and how to manage it. Initially, the children put their learning into practise in the hall by orbiting around the hall avoiding the space junk. This put into perspective just how much space junk there is. As a class, they created some space junk collectors, working extremely hard in their teams, creating some marvellous inventions. They even wrote a letter to NASA to persuade them to sort out the problem.











Year 5 have also enjoyed learning about Georgia O'Keefe in their art lessons. They have explored different oil pastel techniques, producing some excellent work. Well done year 5!
