
Attendance

Lockdown Weekend Activity




Bethel, in Y6, has been unable to put down 'The Goblet of Fire' by J.K. Rowling!

Primary School Admissions for September 2021

CHILDREN BORN BETWEEN THE DATES OF 01/09/2016 AND 31/08/2017

If you have a child due to start school born between the dates above then please be aware of the following:

Summary of important dates

- 16 November 2020: online system opens for parents
- 15 January 2021: closing date for parents to apply
- 12 February 2021: last date for Admissions to deal with any late changes in time for offer day (this includes making offers above the school's admission number)
- 16 April 2021: parents can view the offered school online

You can apply from 16th November 2020 with the vast majority of parents or carers using the online application system, which can be found via the LCC website at www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schooladmissions

Read the information on the website about 'how to apply for a school place' and follow the links to the parent portal where you can set up an account, if you haven't already, in order to apply for various services in relation to schools.

Term 2 Primary School Parents 2020/2021
Be Safe Be Seen

This term's theme is the important topic of being seen. When the clocks go back and it gets darker earlier, drivers find it harder to see people who are out and about.

Bright Ideas



- In the dark and on dull days it is even more important for children to stay close to adults.
- Fluorescent or bright colours are ideal for dull days.
- After dusk you should wear or carry a light or something reflective so that you are more visible.
- If there is no pavement, ensure you always walk along the road facing the oncoming traffic. In the dark move to the verge to allow vehicles to pass as they may not see you.
- Choose routes and crossing places that are well lit.
- Accessorize your outfits with bright and reflective accessories.

Cycling

For safety reasons it is a legal requirement for a bike to have:

- A red reflector to the rear. Front white reflectors and pedal reflectors are also recommended.
- After dark bikes must have a white light to the front and a red light to the rear.
- To help with being seen, cycle the correct way down cycle lanes and ensure road signs and signals are followed.
