<u>Bikeability</u>

The instructor taught the children all about the parts of a bike and how to check for bike and helmet safety. The children learnt how to glide, balance and negotiate spaces and directions and of course brake! The children were all absolutely amazing and learnt some valuable skills.

Thank you to Mrs Florence for providing this wonderful learning experience for our children.








Healthy Eating

The children have been reading the story 'Oliver's Vegetables' by Vivian French and Alison Bartlett. The book tells the story of a fussy eater, Oliver, who only likes chips, until he visits his grandparents and their vegetable garden, where he's challenged to find potatoes and eat whatever else he pulls up. Through this experience, Oliver learns about different vegetables and how they grow, and he even starts to enjoy them. When Oliver's mother arrives to pick him up, she's surprised to find that he's been eating a variety of vegetables, not just chips.



Inspired by the story of Oliver, Reception have been tasting a variety of vegetables including spinach, beetroot, sugar snap peas and red peppers and making and tasting soup. The children have practised how to peel, chop and slice potatoes, onions, spinach, peppers and carrots. They have also spotted the changes that occur once they are cooked in the soup.





The children have also enjoyed fruity pancakes with toppings of berries, lemons, lime and honey.

Forest School - Year 1

Wow, what an eventful session Year 1 had this week! The children started their session with rain and bursts of heavy hail, which they thoroughly enjoyed catching in their hands. Suddenly, the rain and hail stopped and the sun came out, only for the rain and wind to start again towards the end of the session. The very changeable weather did nothing to dampen the spirits of our intrepid explorers. They had great fun being fairy finders. They used magnifying glasses to search for clues that fairies have been in the outdoor area. Lots of evidence was found including footprints, food stores and beds. Year 1 then made fairy houses to encourage them to come back and help our garden grow. They all showed amazing creativity and worked well in their pairs. Some of the houses had swimming pools, fire exits and food stores.

<u>Message from Lawrance Park Committee – Children's Playground</u> Construction

We have exciting news in that two of our older pieces of playground equipment are to be replaced with more modern ones.

The Naseby Tower will be replaced by a two-deck tower connected by a bridge, each deck having a slide. The climbing frame will be replaced by both a horizontal ladder and a traversing forest.

Towards the end of March/beginning of April (weather dependent),

the contractors, Sovereign, will be on site; first removing the existing equipment then installing new equipment, including a wet pour.

During this time, the playground will still be available for use but certain areas will cordoned off. Sovereign have supplied risk assessments and all personnel are DBS checked.

So, please continue to enjoy the playground but be extra careful during construction. As always, the Trustees strongly advise that children are properly supervised by a parent or guardian at all times.


