<u>Year 1 – Forest School</u>

In forest school this week, year one focused on the traditional tale Goldilocks and The Three Bears. They began by finding three items one small, one medium and one big for the three bears. They then split off into groups to create a bed or a chair for one of the three bears. The children had such great imagination, we even had one bed with a security camera outside! They finished off by creating some forest school porridge.



<u>Year 2</u>

On Thursday, Year 2 had an exciting trip to Delaine Buses depot and museum as part of our history topic on local transport. We walked from school to the bus stop and boarded a double decker bus which took us to their depot where we were met by Mr Delaine, the great-grandson of the founder of Delaine Buses. After an interesting talk about how the company started and the developments in bus design, we had a tour of the museum and spotted some really old buses. In the depot, we saw where the buses fill up with fuel and even got to see one bus have its brakes tested. Our final treat, before returning to school, was a ride through the bus wash. The children really impressed all the adults with their super listening, fantastic questions and wonderful behaviour throughout.









<u>Year 3</u>

This afternoon, Year 3 were chosen to go on a special mission through the Ancient Egyptian underworld, learning about hieroglyphs and mummification (through our Now Press Play headphones). They returned to the classroom to further develop their understanding of the mummification process.



Year 4 - Wildlife Photographer Visit

This week, Year 4 enjoyed a visit from local photographer and Thurlby parent, Mr Daniels. In anticipation of Mr Daniel's visit, the children discussed and wrote many thoughtful questions to discover more about wildlife photography and barn owls. Mr Daniels shared some of his wonderful photographs of local wildlife (foxes, badgers, kingfishers and barn owls) and explained how he had been able to capture such amazing images. The class were also able to see pictures which Mr Daniels had taken in South Africa: squabbling hippos, a mud-covered lion and a beautiful portrait of a mountain gorilla. At the end of the session, the children voted for their favourite barn owl image which is to be the inspiration for their poetry writing over the coming weeks.

They feel they can't turn to parents or a trusted adult for support as they fear they may get in trouble or have their devices taken away from them. It can carry on all day, all evening and all weekend for the world to see, causing a lot of emotional stress to the victim and their family.


