

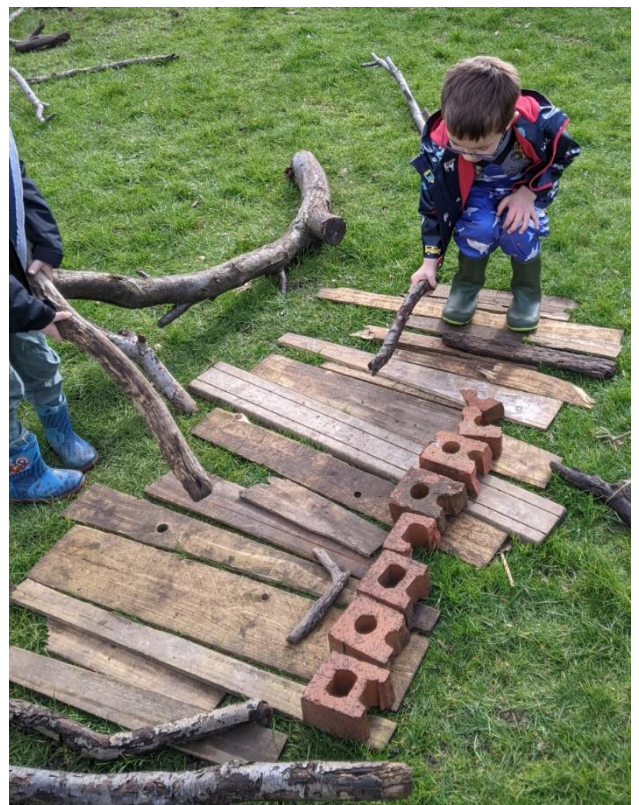

Year 1 Forest School Update

What an exciting afternoon! All the experiences linked to our 'five senses' learning in science. We created a fire circle, lit a class fire and cooked popcorn. We enjoyed the warmth and smell of the fire, the sight of the flames, the sound of the popping kernels and the taste of the warm popcorn. After that, we took part in a group challenge to make a xylophone from natural resources, thinking about how far the sound could travel.



Year 2

Spring has sprung! In Year 2, we learn about how to grow plants in our science lessons. Back in November, we planted our own daffodil bulbs and we patiently waited for the first signs of life. The lovely sunshine we have enjoyed over the last week has been perfect and all of our plants have burst into flower. The children are very excited to be bringing them home and are looking forward to growing more plants next term.



Year 2's Mars Day Virtual Session



On Monday afternoon, as part of their 'Up, Up and Away' topic, Year 2 were treated to an interactive, virtual session with 'Robokids'. The children were given a mission from the UK Space Agency director, Sue Horne, who asked them to help send a robot to space. The children discussed why robots are used for some missions instead of humans. They looked at how people at the Space Agency use coding to programme robots, the amazing things robots can do, and the things scientists hope robots can do in the future. After successfully navigating their flight to Mars, the children even got to see the engineering scientists hope to build on Mars to allow humans to live there in the future. This is very important to Year 2 as scientists believe the very first person to live on Mars may be a school-aged child now!
