EYFS - Oliver's Vegetables

As part of our topic on Being Healthy, Reception have been reading Oliver's Vegetables. We have learnt about different vegetables and about how they contain lots of goodness to keep your body healthy.

We made observational drawings of different cabbages, used vegetables to print with and have had lots of fun experimenting with different soup recipes. The children developed their fine motor skills with cutting, chopping and peeling a variety of vegetables and used a soup maker to cook and blend the soup.

At the end of the day, we had a soup cafe where we tasted the soups and decided what flavours and textures we preferred. The most popular flavour was "Green soup" which contained leeks, potatoes, spinach, broccoli, onion and pepper mixed with a vegetable stock cube.

The least popular was "Everyone's Spicy Soup" which they reflected

had a bit too much black pepper as it made their tongues tingle! We were so impressed that everyone tried at least some of the soups that were packed with superpowered vegetables.





Year 1- Forest School

In forest school this week, year one explored their five senses. We started by exploring what we could see in our forest school area using our magnifying googles. Then we used stethoscopes to see if we could hear water inside of the trees. We listened out for what we could hear around us. We even got to smell and try some different herbs and drink some nettle tea. We finished our session by making our own potions with different things we could find in our forest school area.








<u> Year 5</u>

Year 5 have had an incredibly busy week, utilising lots of wonderful learning opportunities and experiences, specifically Bikeability. During Bikeability, children have learnt valuable cycling skills, such as; road positions (minor and major), signalling, passing and what to do at junctions.
