#### Forest School

In their second session, Year 2 used their senses to explore the forest school site. They worked in pairs and had to mark on a map where they were and then use either sight, smell, touch or hearing and make notes, either written or drawings, of what they saw, smelt, felt or heard. They repeated this several times moving around the site and using different senses.

Next, they used blindfolds and guided their partners to objects to feel and guess what they were and then stethoscopes to listen to the sounds of stomping feet, tapping fingers, or the inside of a tree. All the children showed great enthusiasm and teamwork. The session finished with a taste test of some plants from the school garden; they tried chocolate mint, coriander, ginger mint, parsley and salad leaves.









# Wildlife Club

The weather has been perfect for our first two sessions of Wildlife Club. This week, the children worked in pairs trying to solve clues which matched images of birds' eggs to images (hidden amongst our beautiful school grounds) of birds.





The children also learnt about and listened to the dawn chorus. Finally, they each made a simple bird feeder which they placed amongst the trees.
