Year one have been learning about our local area in in Geography and History this term. We went on a walk around the village looking at how things have changed over the years and we planned our route from the school to the post office.





## <u>Year 2</u>

In Year 2, we learn about how plants grow and this week we looked at how some plants grow from bulbs. We examined daffodil bulbs and then all planted a bulb. We have put the plant pots outside our classroom and will be watching and waiting for the first signs of growth.



## <u>Maths</u>

Year 2 have become experts on shape this term and showcased their amazing skills by building their own 3D shapes. They then compared the shapes by identifying the shape of the faces and counting the edges and vertices.











## <u>Year 6</u>

As part of their science studies this term, Year 6 have been studying light and shadows. Earlier lessons covered how light travels, reflection, mirrors and optical instruments, especially Newton's 'Reflective Telescope'. Last week, their studies led to a practical activity to construct a periscope. This week, the children studied the composition of 'white light'. This led into a fascinating practical investigation using prisms to separate white light into the 7 constituent colours before writing an explanation as to how and why this occurred.
