Forest School


At the beginning of our last forest school session, we had to find fact cards about different insects which were hidden around the site. We learnt some interesting facts from them.

<u>Year 1</u>




We'd also like to give a special thank you to our wonderful volunteer, Mrs. Baldwin, for her help and encouragement as the children completed their creations.

Well done Year 1, you are true art superstars!










Thurlby Tales Club
