Many parents have often said, in different forums, that they wish for there to be a range of extra-curricular clubs for their children. We always listen and have tried to accommodate as much as possible. This does mean that staff members put time and effort into preparing, setting up and running the clubs for the children. It is very disappointing that some children are simply not turning up to after school clubs and parents are not informing us of this. We understand that sometimes a club might not be right for individuals but at school, we work on building resilience and not giving up at the first hurdle...as we know, as adults, we need to build robust children to be able to make resilient adults. We also often have waiting lists for some clubs so would appreciate direct communication from parents if your child no longer requires a place.

Do you find your child's behaviour puzzling or frustrating on occasions?

Angela Pinchin and Jacqueline Clark, Bourne Westfield Primary Academy, are planning another course entitled 'Understanding Your Child'. All parents may benefit from this reflective course that covers relationships, managing emotions, reducing conflict, sleep, eating, anxiety, anger tantrums – and of course, boundary battles! It is a relaxed and accepting environment, suitable for anyone involved with children aged 0 – 18 and everyone is welcome. It will run on a Wednesday evening, at Bourne Westfield Primary Academy, from 6.15 – 8pm for 8 weeks, commencing 30th April 2025. The cost is £24 and this is payable prior to the course, or £3 per week, whichever you feel would suit you.


Local events/clubs

Stamford Model Railway Show

Over the weekend of 10-11 May, this charity will host its annual model railway exhibition at Stamford Welland Academy. It will be the largest such exhibition in East Anglia. With six halls containing 30 layouts (some specifically for younger ones to operate) and 20 traders from across the UK, we hope to have something for all ages and interests. In addition, we'll have a KZone, especially for the very young ones to 'play trains' and a Learning Zone where some of the many skills of modelling will be demonstrated. This year, too, we will have train driver simulators, generously provided by GBRf, one of the largest rail freight companies in the country.

DIRECTIONS:

Stamford Welland Academy is situated at the northern end of Green Lane. Turning off the A6121, Recreation Ground Road becomes Kings Road, then Green Lane

Stamford railway station (hourly trains from Peterborough, Birmingham, Melton Mowbray and Oakham) is on the south side of the town. Walk along Station Road to the traffic lights. Turn Dakannin is of the South side of the town. Was along Station Road to the training inclining the left over the river bridge and up St Mary's Hill. Take any alley way ahead of you to High Street, up Ironmonger Street to Broad Street. Cross Broad Street and take the alleyway ahead to North Street. Turn right and walk for about 60 metres. Take the next left (Recreation Ground Road). Follow the road to the end. The walk is largely up hill and will take about 25-30 minutes.

Stamford Bus Station is on St Peters Street. Walk up All Saints Street and cross the main road, keeping All Saints church on your left. Walk up Broad Street (which is quite narrow to start with)! Follow the road past the old cinema and Corn Exchange. Take the alleyway opposite to North Street then follow the directions as for train travel.

A free bus service will be provided, commencing at the train station and stopping at the major town car parks. A timetable will be published on line.


