# Car Park Safety Competition

We are launching a competition for our children to create an engaging poster urging people to:

- reduce their speed
- park considerately
- promote healthier lifestyle choices when travelling to and from school each day

As you know, we have sent out reminders, previously, explaining that some of the driving and parking near the school site is dangerous and inconsiderate which compromises the safety of you, your children and the local residents.

The winning poster will be displayed around the village in the hope that driving and parking improves for the safety of our community.

Please read our reasons for this correspondence and the competition guidelines carefully:

- Cars drive too quickly right outside our school gates and in the local streets surrounding our school
- Some individuals seem to forget or ignore the fact that there are children crossing and that, every single day, these children put their lives in driver's hands
- Parking inconsiderately, either within the car park or along the nearby streets, is also often hazardous and again, children have said they feel 'unsafe when getting out of the car to cross the road to school'
- Local residents do not appreciate people parking directly outside their driveways; meaning there are times when they cannot leave their house to get to work/an appointment
- There would be times where the Emergency Services would not be able to attend an incident down Crown Lane or a neighbouring road causing what could be a fatal delay to save someone's life/property

We urge you to park and stride whenever possible and if you can't, PLEASE drive and park safely.

Competition Rules:

- These posters should be completed at home
- The poster must be on plain A4 paper
- Please ensure that the spelling of all words is correct
- The poster must be clearly written, in large lettering, with felt tips/sharpies and not colouring pencils as it needs to stand out to drivers
- The poster should be simple and effective with phrases/slogans e.g. 'slow down', 'park sensibly', 'safety first', 'no need for speed', 'park and stride'
- Children may work with their siblings from other year groups / friends to complete a joint poster
- The deadline for the entries is Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> May
- Children should hand their poster in to Mrs Pengelly or Mrs Burton at the office
- The winner will be chosen by Mrs Finch and the PTFA

# IMPORTANT - Online Safety Update for Parents

It has come to our attention that children are using gaming /websites inappropriately whilst at home. This involves playing games that are NOT AGE APPROPRIATE, creating false accounts, sending unkind messages to people and using search engines to look at unsuitable subjects online. Age restrictions are placed on games/websites to protect children from content that is harmful to their emotional and mental wellbeing.

It is important that children feel confident in disclosing to adults when they see or experience something which upsets them or makes them feel uncomfortable - whether that is to talk to a trusted adult in school or family member. As school staff and parents, we must all be mindful that this sort of thing exists and even if you think that your child is responsible whilst gaming/ online, they can be easily influenced by friends or outside sources so PLEASE CHECK.

We should always be available to; listen to our children, reassure them and discuss when they feel uncomfortable online.

Also a reminder that TikTok has recently updated their parental controls so parents/carers can have more control over what their children are doing online. **Please note**, **TikTok has an age limit of 13**.
