Flu vaccinations - Tuesday 24th November

You will recall a parentmail was sent in June and again in September, for our new Reception parents, giving details of how to complete the online consent form for your child/children. For those parents who have registered, we understand that you have received letters from the NHS which include barcodes for scanning on the vaccination day. I have spoken to the Lincolnshire team who will be administering these vaccinations at our school, on the above date. They have confirmed that they do not have access to barcode scanners and will NOT be requiring children to bring these NHS letters into school on the day.
