Year 2 have enjoyed being botanists, as part of our science topic on the journey of a plant, this term. We have been carefully studying, measuring and sketching the plants and trees around the school and are now investigating what plants need to grow.

<u> Year 3 - Science</u>

Year 3 spent Tuesday afternoon studying plants as part of their scientific learning. In order to understand more about the appearance and function of leaves, the children studied them with magnifying glasses and made careful observations. The children were then able to match the leaves to the type of plant they originated from and made scientific, annotated drawings to develop their knowledge.





Year 4 Forest School

The class have been very excited during Forest School for the last two weeks and are loving learning about Islam through the outdoors. Last week, the children used twigs, branches and logs to create The Five Pillars of Islam. They were set a challenge for all pillars to be secured in the ground as well as being the same height. This encouraged great team work and problem-solving skills. I'm pleased to announce all groups succeeded after various ways of exploring how to do it!

This week, we have been learning about Ramadan and how it is determined by the phases of the moon. In groups, the children made the crescent and waning moon using natural resources. Individually, the children moulded a ball of clay into the shape of a hand and engraved a henna design - this practice is part of the celebrations at the end of Ramadan. The afternoon ended by completing Islamic drawings on the slabs using charcoal.



<u>Year 5</u> Bikeability



The majority of our Year 5 children took part in the Lincolnshire County Council Bikeability scheme this week. The children spent their first day practising basic skills within the MUGA and then transferred these skills onto the Thurlby village roads; practising various manoeuvres, with the instructors, for the remaining 3 days of training. The instructors expressed how delightful the children have been, well behaved and polite throughout their sessions. We are very proud of how our children have represented our school within the community this week. Well done to all!

Some Year 5 children had an exciting week completing a special project.

As I was not doing Bikeability, I did a <u>VERY</u> fun project instead. I got to make a rainforest in a shoe box. We used Ipads for research and then used; tissue paper, paint, googly eyes, twigs, PVA glue, ivy, bark, leaves, paper, sequins, pipe cleaners, pompoms, rocks, mini pinecones, stickers, feathers, beads, lollipop sticks, blossom, shiny paper, little colourful sticks and wool.



Mrs Edgar helped us with our boxes and we went outside to find our natural materials. I loved making my mini rainforest!
