#### Family Learning Workshop - 'Healthy Me'

This week, we had our third Family Learning workshop 'Healthy Me'. In this session, we looked into ways to help children understand their emotions with tips and games on ways to help them name and express how they are feeling. We also explored regulation tools for both adults and children to help support everyone's wellbeing. The highlight of the session was the joint session, where the learner's completed different activities with their children, to embed the learning that took place such as emotion plate faces, an emotions board game, mindful colouring and even emotion charades.





#### **Reception**

Thurlby Hospital opened in the Role Play area and the Emergency department was very busy with broken hands, poorly legs, stomach upsets, eye problems. The doctors, nurses and consultants were rushed off their feet with appointments and making diagnoses as well administering; medicine, injections, applying bandages and operations. The patients were very dramatic!





We made Easter nests, noticing what happened to the chocolate when it was heated up and mixing it with Shredded Wheat.

We had a sunny Show and Tell for Mummies/Mammas/Grandmas/Aunties, where we served drinks and snacks whilst having a well-deserved sit down. The children drew pictures of Mummy and Me, shared stories and their 'Amazing Mummy' writing, played with pink playdough and herbs and served shimmering Rose Petal Tea.









#### <u> Year 2 - Class Assembly</u>

#### WOW, Year 2...what a performance!

This week, Year 2 presented their class play all about 'Animals and their Habitats'. They performed in different ways through singing, dancing and presenting their knowledge with confidence and pride. It also included a quiz, that the children made in their ICT lessons. You were all amazing and we are very proud of you.





#### <u> Forest School – Year 1</u>

This week, Year 1 have been using their senses to explore the forest school area. They wrote and drew pictures of what they could hear, see, feel, taste and smell. Great fun was had using blindfolds when feeling objects to guess what they were and listening to the trees and the ground using stethoscopes. Some children said they could hear creatures moving underground and a pump in the trees was water moving through them.

After exploring, Year 1 used what they had discovered to create potions. They all looked and smelt amazing and some even had sparkles in them. The potions could turn you into a werewolf, a vampire, a bat, a unicorn, a superhero or a zombie. We were all impressed with how well they worked together, well done Year 1.





#### <u>Year 6 sculptures – Alberto Giacometti</u>


Year 6 have been studying the artist Alberto Giacommetti, who was considered to be one of the most important sculptures of the twentieth century. The children studied some of his work and discussed his style, which was influenced by Cubism and Surrealism. We discussed the appearance of the elongated figures and started to come up with our own poses for a transition project. Over many weeks, the children styled wire, primed the surfaces with PVA glue and coloured their sculpture with paint and metallic crayons. Their final pieces were amazing - all unique and a possible treasured memento of their time at Thurlby!



#### <u> Persuasive speeches – Year 6</u>

Year 6 have been studying the features and attributes of a persuasive speech and creating their very own. Taking inspiration from Duncan Harrison, Martin Luther-King and Malala Yousafzai, the children unpicked what makes a successful speech in terms of content and delivery. The class then debated persuasive arguments and started to create their draft speeches. After much deliberation and rehearsal, six pupils were chosen by their classmates to present their final speeches to Mrs Finch on Monday. Mrs Finch was extremely impressed with the children's oracy skills as well as their sophisticated language and persuasive tactics. So, the question is...will Year 6 pupils be allowed to go on the field this summer for break times or not? Watch this space!

#### Swimming

Just a reminder that swimming starts for our Years 3, 4 and 5 children on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> April and continues until Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2025 (excluding holiday period). Children will attend in three class groups during the morning sessions. Towels and swimming attire will therefore be required on these dates. Boys should wear trunks or short swimming shorts. Girls should wear a one-piece swimsuit. Goggles are allowed to be worn. No earrings are allowed to be worn so please ensure your child does not come to school wearing earrings on swimming days.

#### <u>Year 3</u>

Please note that children in Year 3 will need to come to school 'swim ready' meaning that they will need to have their swimwear on underneath their uniforms. Year 3 will be leaving school at 8:45am so please ensure your child arrives at school on time.

Please ensure that swim attire and towels come to school in a separate backpack/bag so that they do not make other items damp in lockers.


