Reception - Brick by Brick... Week 1

It started with the discovery of a brick in the garden, then the children found more and more until we had 4! They transported them in the wagon and the wheelbarrow as they were quite heavy. Some boys decided we needed to build a wall so Mrs Dubell suggested we might need to make some cement to help it stick together.

We tried using the tools we had but the children felt they needed something flatter to spread the cement (mud). The next day, Mrs Dubell brought in more bricks and some trowels which definitely made things more sophisticated. There was such a lot of conversation, problem solving and negotiating, not to mention concentrating. Trying to get the right consistency of the mud/cement was a whole morning's work! The children revisited this "job" over several days refining their skills and explorations, more children joined the group and learnt from the more experienced children.

We were finding that the wall was a bit wobbly so we called in the experts- Leo's Daddy from Silva Build! Mr Silva kindly came in to demonstrate the tools and techniques involved. We learnt what bricks were made of, how to mix mortar, how to use a spirit level to make sure the wall wasn't wonky and how to arrange the bricks in a pattern to keep it stable.











The children also transferred their ideas into other contexts such as building castles and palaces indoors. Afterwards, the children were very keen to suggest other ways they could make this pattern. They considered lego, blocks and shapes.






<u>Week 2</u>

This week, the children revisited their interest in connecting and joining and mixing. The tape measures and spirit levels were used in pretend play. Investigations took place to find out the size of the models and if the construction was level.

The small constructions have become more elaborate, compartments and different levels have needed to be certain sizes to ensure vehicles could fit in.





Outdoors, the large-scale planks, crates and blocks were transported as a team to create a very carefully balanced track and ramp for the outdoor vehicles and trucks. The children worked very hard to ensure their constructions were precise; making sure the angles and the spaces fitted the sizes and requirements needed.

The children were able to reason with each other and find solutions, even where, at times, they disagreed with other children's opinions. They had remembered words like "mortar" and "trowel" and thought about which direction the bricks needed to be.







Year 5 - Visit to Grimm and Co, Rotherham

On Wednesday, Year 5 visited the amazing emporium of stories (Grimm and Co). The visit involved the children creating their own stories with the most magical inspirations. The children were extremely enthusiastic, very creative in their ideas and were engaged in all activities. It was so wonderful to listen to their imaginative and truly wacky ideas! We even got our own books illustrated by a live illustrator and then published so that we could take them home to show our families.

One of the biggest hits of the day was the beanstalk side. It was pitchblack inside and made a few of the girls and boys scream! Even the staff had a go down the beanstalk slide...we couldn't help ourselves...Mrs Finch went down first for 'health and safety reasons' and took a photo of every child coming down the slide for them to show to their families. What a wonderful experience and thoroughly enjoyed by all. Thank you to the Trust's Powerful Language Project for organising this trip.
