<u>Year 1</u>

On Wednesday 5th October, Year 1 went on a walk around Thurlby to learn about the history and features of the village. We walked to the old dairy which originally had cows in and later turned into a milk delivery service. Next, we explored the history of Ivy House that once was a working farm with the stables. We had the opportunity to look down the well which is over 400 years old. As we walked past school, we learnt about the origin of Crown Lane noticing the crown shape cut into the hedge. While we were exploring, we were on the hunt for human and physical features in a scavenger hunt all around the village. We were caught in a little bit of rain, but Year 1 had an amazing time.
