### GEOGRAPHY

#### Term 5: Africa/Kenya





- To know where Africa is on a world map and where the UK is in relation. Africa is a continent which is made up of 54 different countries and each country has its own flag
- To know that the biggest country in Africa is Algeria and the smallest country is Gambia.
- To know that Kenya is a country in East Africa and that its capital in Nairobi
- To know that Naivasha is a market town in Kenya which is a popular tourist resort
- To know that wildlife tours are very popular in Naivasha, and tourists go on safari to see the 'Big Five' animals: rhino, lion, leopard, cape buffalo and elephant
- To know that farming is important to Naivasha, especially growing flowers (compare with Lincolnshire). Compare Nairobi and Naivasha with Thurlby and Bourne
- To know that there are different groups of people and that Maasai and Luo tribes live in Kenya. They are farmers. Compare with life of child in the UK.

### Term 6:

- To know and locate seaside resorts around the UK on a map and know that Skegness is in Lincolnshire and that Hunstanton is in Norfolk
- To use digital maps and photographs to describe the features for each location
- To know key PHYSICAL features found by the sea: beach, cliff, coast
- To know key HUMAN features found by the coast: port, harbour, and shop
- To know that the coast has many different uses: leisure, fishing, tourism
- Conduct simple fieldwork at Hunstanton
